

Progress Report on "OIC Statistical Capacity Building (STATCAB) Programme and Statistics Related Meetings"

1 Completed Activities


The OIC-StatCom Secretariat gives special attention to facilitate the flow of statistical and professional know-how among the National Statistical Systems (NSSs) of the OIC Member Countries. The OIC Statistical Capacity Building Programme (StatCaB) aims to identify and implement statistical skills improvement activities by matching the capacities and needs of the National Statistical Offices (NSOs) of the OIC Member Countries based on the responses provided to the biannual survey. The last survey titled "*OIC Statistical Capacity Building Programme (StatCaB) Questionnaire for the Biennium 2018-2019*" was circulated in August 2017. The Survey has received a record number of responses from 41 NSOs of the OIC Member Countries¹ and 1 response received from the Ministry of Public Service of Uganda.

During the last decade as shown below, the Centre has organized over **317 statistical** activities including **256 StatCaB programmes** (i.e., **216 short-term statistics courses**, **27 study visits** and **13 technical missions**), **55 international workshops** and **6 OIC Statistical Commission sessions** with the participation of thousands of experts from the NSOs of OIC member countries.



¹ Despite the regular reminders sent, 15 NSOs of the OIC Member Countries – including Algeria, Bahrain, Burkina Faso, Cote d'Ivoire, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Guyana, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Morocco, Nigeria, Tunisia, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan – have not yet communicated their survey responses.





48 OIC member countries and 1 organisation benefitted from the **256 short-term statistical courses, technical missions, and study visits** between 2007 and April 2018. These activities facilitated by SESRIC could not have been realized without the generous support of 23 OIC member countries and 2 organisations since 2007.


The top ten countries contributed to StatCaB since 2007 are Turkey (62), Egypt (25), Indonesia (24), Malaysia (19), Jordan (18), Cote d'Ivoire (13), Morocco (12), Tunisia (12), Azerbaijan (10) and Senegal (10).

From the beneficiary perspective, Azerbaijan (17), Sudan (12), Bangladesh (10), Benin, (10), Kazakhstan (10), Afghanistan (9), Kuwait (9), Malaysia (9), Libya (8) and Maldives (8) are the top ten countries benefited from StatCaB since 2007.


Also in 2017, the first-ever statistical activities in the forms of short-term courses facilitated by SESRIC were benefitted to 3 OIC member countries including *Gabon, Iran*, *Palestine* and 1 international organisation, namely *ISESCO* based in Chad.



Number of StatCaB Programs Conducted, by Provider, 2007-April 2018




Number of StatCaB Programs Conducted, by Beneficiary, 2007-April 2018







Analyzing the breakdown of the 317 statistical activities conducted between 2007 and April 2018, 121 (38%) of activities are related to economic statistics while 64 (20%) of programs are on methodology of data collection, processing, dissemination and analysis. Demographic and social statistics is the third domain with 51 activities accounting for 16% of all activities. Environment and multi-domain statistics is another domain where more than 41 (13%) activities had been conducted. Related to the managerial sides of official statistics, in total 40 activies were realized of which 30 (9%) of them were on strategic and managerial issues of official statistics and 10 (3%) aimed towards improving professional skills for official statisticians.



The breakdown of the 317 statistical activities conducted between 2007 and April 2018 by theme shows that the top of list hosts 48 data related activities (15%), 26 multi-dimensional statistical activities (8%), 19 labour statistics (6%), 19 tourism statistics (6%), 18 agriculture statistics (6%), 18 national accounts (6%), 17 health statistics (5%), 17 poverty statistics (5%), 16 activities related to surveys (5%), 14 trade statistics (4%) and 13 activities related to statistics on infrastructure (4%).







During the period between second week of November 2016 (after the Sixth Session of OIC-StatCom) and end week of April 2018, a total of **99 statistical activities** were conducted by SESRIC. Of those, 65 of them were short-term statistics courses, 18 of them were study visits, 5 of them were technical mission, and 11 of them were international workshops.

In total around 1,800 participants from 31 OIC member countries and 1 international organisation benefited from SESRIC statistical activities provided by 22 OIC member countries and 10 international organisations.

2 Way Forward

Based on the interactions with the NSOs of the OIC Member Countries during the current period, the following changes / amendments are planned for the upcoming period:

- Collection of the biannual survey through an online form instead of Excel files;
- More statistical sub-activities to be asked in the biannual survey as broader items of the Classification of Statistical Activities (CSA Revision 1, Oct. 2009) taxonomy sometimes oversee the activities sought and/or to be provided;
- The received StatCaB materials will be uploaded into SESRIC e-Learning platform (<u>http://www.oicstatcom.org/study-materials.php</u>).



- Organisational processes will start with the Terms of Reference to be provided by the beneficiary countries after the matching of the countries with needs and capacities for the related statistical;
- Increase the number of OIC Member Countries to provide activities under the StatCaB Programme;
- Responding more to the on-demand requests of the NSOs of the OIC Member Countries.
- Organising longer study visits and courses; and
- Bring about more synergies in statistical capacity development with the regional agencies; such as, GCC-STAT, UNESCWA, for the benefit of the OIC Member Countries.
