Malatya is located in the Upper Euphrates Basin of the Eastern Anatolia Region of Turkey. Malatya's history extends to the Palaeolithic, Neolithic, Chalcolithic and Bronze Ages. Assyrians, Persians, Romans, Byzantines, Arabs, Seljuks and Ottomans ruled the city. It was a strategic gateway and a trading centre for almost all civilizations, and so control of Malatya frequently changed hands.

<u>Akçadağ</u>

Akçadağ has a rich historical heritage. These include the mounds at Akçadağ called Ören and İkinciler, Ferik Castle of Hittites, and rock graves. The following destinations will be visit in Akçadağ:

<u>Arapgir</u>

It is thought that the first settlement of Arapgir dates back to circa 1200 BC. The rulers of Arapgir were Assyrians, Romans, Byzantines, Umayyads, Abbasids, Danişments, Anatolian Seljuks, Karakoyunlus and Ottomans. The study visit to Arapgir will be held at the last day of the study visit and the following historical places will be visited during the study visit:

- Old Arapgir Castle (Anatolian-Seljukian period)
- Millet Han
- Grand Mosque
- Cafer Paşa Mosque
- Mirliva Ahmet Paşa Mosque
