



A Census of Agriculture for the 21st Century

A census of agriculture is a statistical operation for collecting, processing and disseminating data on the structure of agriculture, covering the whole or a significant part of a country. Being the tenth round in the decennial programme of agricultural censuses, the World Programme for the Census of Agriculture (WCA) 2020 covers agricultural censuses to be carried out by countries between 2016 and 2025. For WCA 2020, the objectives of the agricultural census are to provide data on the structure of agriculture, especially for small administrative units, and to enable detailed cross-tabulations; to provide data to use as benchmarks for and reconciliation of current agricultural statistics; and to provide frames for agricultural sample surveys. The presenters will be sharing their country experiences on identifying technical and financial requirements to conduct the planned agricultural censuses; designing data collection forms according to WCA 2020 methodology; and developing inclusive workplans to cover the steps in line with FAO's Guidelines publication on World Programme of the Census of Agriculture 2020 Volume I.

Developing National Statistics Systems on International Labour Migration

International labour migration is a rising policy priority and there is a need to respond equitably to the interests of countries of origin and countries of destination, as well as to the interests of migrant workers. The lack of comprehensive statistical information regarding international labour migration and its impact on national development has hindered the effective integration of labour migration into national development strategies. Particularly, the absence of international standards regarding concepts, definitions and methodologies for the measurement of international labour migration and migrant workers continues to be a major obstacle to the production of harmonized statistics. One of the reasons for this is the shortcomings in the capacities of the countries to produce statistically sound figures and estimates. From this aspect, supporting the countries to develop their national statistics on international labour based on the conceptual frameworks developed by the relevant international agencies is critical. Within this perspective, this session will give the opportunity to participants to listen to the conceptual frameworks developed by the international agencies to measure international labour migration and learn from the experiences of the OIC countries to produce the related statistics on this emerging phenomenon.
